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Coconino County Success Story


It's true what they say—not all superheros wear capes.

A partnership between Coconino County Health and Human Services and the Coconino County Workforce Development Board resulted in the availability of WIOA Rapid Response dollars to assist with emergency response and recovery in Coconino County. Add in a collaboration with Home Depot and even more help was provided to residents impacted by the Tunnel Fire when they needed it most. Most recently, Home Depot came to the aid of residents Luis, a licensed contractor, and Lance, who owns a painting company. The two were personally impacted by the Tunnel Fire. They lost their homes and many of the tools used for their businesses. Home Depot was able to provide them with a meaningful discount on the supplies and WIOA Rapid Response funds were used to purchase the items needed to get their businesses back at full capacity. Thank you to Home Depot and the many individuals and organizations across Coconino County that have assisted during the Tunnel Fire response and recovery.







NTN Update - Fiscal Agent Designation

- ➤ In 2019, the NTN LWDB was the designated Fiscal Agent
- > Funds were distributed to each of the 13 Tribes
 - DOL found this lack of a single entity to function as the Fiscal Agent non-compliant:
 - Conflict of interest
 - No oversight to ensure compliance
- > DES instructed NTN to designate one entity as the Fiscal Agent

NTN Update - Fiscal Agent Designation

- ➤ In 2021, the NTN designated the Pascua Yaqui Tribe (PYT) as the Fiscal Agent for Program Year 2021
- In May 2022, PYT notified the NTN that PYT could not serve as the Fiscal Agent
- On June 29, 2022, the NTN designated Local Arizona First (LFA) as the designated Fiscal Agent
- On August 1, 2022, LFA notified the NTN that LFA could not serve as the Fiscal Agent


NTN Update - Fiscal Agent Designation

- On August 3, DES provided an alternative option for the NTN where DES will conduct a competitive procurement to identify an entity for the NTN to designate as the Fiscal Agent.
 - NTN has also reached out to Phoenix Indian Center.
- Impact on NTN Funding
 - DES issued subawards for PY21 adult and youth funding to the 13 tribes
 - The Salt River Pima-Maricopa Indian Community has agreed to accept funds to pay for NTN Board activities and staff through September.
 - Currently DES cannot issue allocated funds for dislocated worker services as there is no entity designated by the NTN to receive these funds






